BACKGROUND

Sierra Leone faces food insecurity, which impacts over half its population. Almost 2 million children lack sufficient food, and over 1 million are at risk of child abuse. The School Feeding Programs improve educational access, and can improve supply chain of locally sourced foods, which is a commitment of the Government in Sierra Leone
