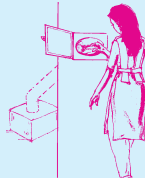

Empowered youth to engage for disaster preparedness and risk reduction at community



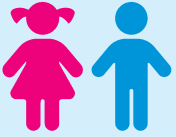
Increased accountability among duty bearers to provide adolescent friendly service at schools and community

COVID-19 RESPONSE



Plan International Nepal delivered emergency medical equipment and health safety materials to 26 rural/ municipalities and raised awareness against the COVID-19 pandemic. With the support around 138,000 (female 73,531, male 64,469) people received medical aid and safety information to protect from the virus. With our support, youth reporters and young people contributed to raise awareness about the importance vaccination, as a result around 1.2 million people at least get the first or one dose of vaccination in our working areas.

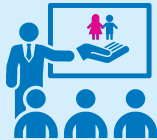

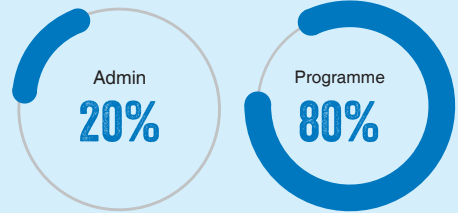

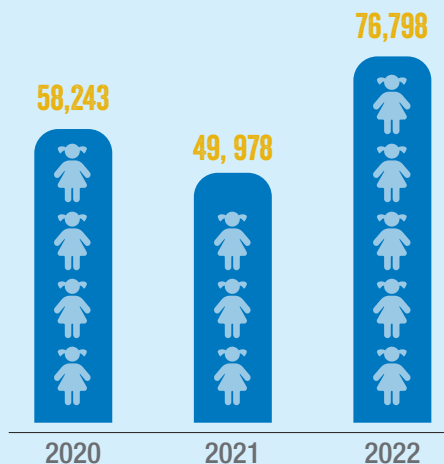
